**Ways to pay your Platte City Utility Bill**

Platte City offers many ways to pay your City water, wastewater and solid waste bill. Choose the method that fits you best:

- A. Traditional mail return, checks only, do not send cash through the mail
- B. In person at City Hall, 400 Main Street Platte City
- C. On line, through the City website, www.plattecitey.org. Set up and manage your account on line,
- D. Automatic Draft (ACH) or Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) from your checking or savings account.
- E. City Utility drop box, 4th street side of City Hall.

Contact Utility Billing at 858-3046 to discuss the option that is the best fit for you.

Business License Reminder

Do not forget your business license. Renew without penalty before March 1, 2015. Renewal information was mailed to current licensees. If you did not receive a renewal notice or do not have a current license, please contact City Hall at (816) 858-3046 or check the web site at www.plattecitey.org

Winter Driving and Snow Routes.

Winter weather can make driving a challenge. Be aware of the extra distance required to stop on wet, icy or snowy surface.

Please pay attention to Snow Route signs. During snow events, please do not park on streets.

Safety tips for homeowners

- Make sure all your exterior doors have good locks-at least deadbolt locks with a minimum 1" throw.
- Use the locks you have. Always lock up when you go out, even if only for a few minutes.
- Make sure outside doors and door frames are solid, 1 3/4" metal or hardwood.
- Secure sliding glass doors with commercially available bars or locks, or put a wooden dowel or broom handle in the door track.
- Make sure your windows have good locks, particularly those at ground level. Lock double-hung windows by sliding a small-headed bolt or nail through a hole drilled at a slight downward angle in a top corner of the inside sash.
- Make sure all porches, entrances, and outside areas are well lighted.
- Trim any bushes or trees that hide doors or windows. Keep ladders and tools inside when you're not using them.
- Don't hide your keys under the doormat or flowerpot.
- Record serial numbers on valuable property like televisions and DVD players and store the numbers in a safe place.
- Consider installing an alarm system.
- If you park your car outside of your garage; lock the doors and avoid leaving the garage door opener visible.
