Compared to the same period (Jan – Sept) last year the Platte City Police department had fewer overall calls for service. Some categories that saw large changes were welfare check (26 fewer), disturbance calls (31 fewer) and motorist assists (45 fewer). The highest volume of service calls during September, excluding traffic stops, include: report information 11%, suspicious person-vehicle 4.5%, disturbance 4%, and alarm calls 4%.

INVESTIGATIONS

Currently, the department is working on seven open investigations related to cases involving sexual assault of minors, aggravated assaults involving deadly weapons, a drug (heroin) overdose, an ongoing narcotics investigation, a theft case, and a passing bad checks case.

Ten case files were submitted to the Platte County Prosecutor's Office in September for consideration of charges: two burglaries, five thefts, two fraudulent use of a credit devices, and one aggravated assault. In addition, four other cases involving thefts were closed for lack of evidence.
